CHIPOTLE: IT'S NOT FOOD, IT'S VIOLENCE



WHY CHIPOTLE?

Chipotle is one of the largest animal killers in the world. The company, formerly owned by McDonald's, has billions of dollars in yearly sales -- up to 95% of which involve violence against animals.

Chipotle is a fraud. Chipotle claims to treat animals with "love" and "integrity." It financed the distribution of a "pro-farmer" documentary, American Meat, that was described as "exemplifying the history of meat production... by arguing that the industry is essential to the sustainability of our civilization." It has hired prominent chefs who have been publicly unapologetic about their disdain for animal welfare. ("You put tripe in a bowl and tell them it's from a humanely raised cow, and they're going to eat it," said one to the New York Times.) Chipotle's marketing has, in short, preyed on its customers' good intentions, despite the fact that the company purchases flesh from the same concentrated animal feedlot operations ("factory farms") as other fast-food chains.

VICTIMS OF THE HUMANE MYTH





As Chipotle goes, others follow. Due to its size, notoriety, and growth, other companies look to Chipotle for guidance. Taco Bell, for example, recently released a "Cantina Bell" line of items that mimics Chipotle's marketing: "Every ingredient has a story." But there is a story that Chipotle does not want told – the story of the animals who were murdered for corporate profit.
